Description:	The Fulbright Program was established in 1946 to advance international study and teaching. Approximately 294,000 "Fulbrighters," 111,000 from the United States and 183,000 from other countries, have participated in the Program since its inception over sixty years ago. The Fulbright Program awards approximately 7,500 new grants annually. Currently, the Fulbright Program operates in over 155 countries worldwide.
Selection Criteria:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be U.S. citizen at the time of application • Preference will usually be given to candidates who have not resided or studied in the country to which they are applying for more than six months. • Hold a B.A. degree or the equivalent before the beginning date of the grant. • Have sufficient proficiency in the written and spoken language of the host country to communicate well • Satisfactory Certificate of Health from a physician • Strong academic record • Superb proposal for research in the country to which you are applying
Application Procedure:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Review the Fulbright Scholars website thoroughly to ensure that the scholarship is a good fit for you. Determine which country you'd like to apply for, and make sure it is a country that is available for the Fulbright scholarship. 2. Make an appointment with Karla Guinigundo at the Office of International Education to gain tips on applying. Contact her at guinigkm@muohio.edu or 513-529-5622. 3. Identify a faculty member who can assist you with your application (particularly the research/study project or grant statement). Do research on the intended country and on your proposed project/grant. 4. Create a draft of your project/grant and personal statement, and share with your faculty advisor and other experts. Revise as needed.

	<ol style="list-style-type: none">5. Submit to the Office of International Education early in the fall semester for their review.6. If selected as a finalist, you will undergo an interview on campus.7. If selected to be a nominee, complete the foreign language evaluation, secure references, letter of affiliation, official transcript(s), and certificate of health.8. Submit all application materials online by deadline.9. The Office of International Education will mail a hard copy of all materials so that it arrives by the deadline.
